

Jennifer McAtamney: T.Y. Sarah

Sarah Brummett (she, her): Sydney- we utilize a population measure for suicide fatality rates. These are reported per 100,000

Sarah Brummett (she, her): both for crude rate and age-adjusted

Andrea Nederveld: Just observing that in our topic generating activities, peer support came up as something people were interested in as well, so something to keep in mind. Also, I was wondering if we can get HKCS or other datasets from OSP? I know that it is not always possible to just get that data from the source.

Sarah Brummett (she, her): Erica- we do have data that would be proxies for suicide attempts. However, we know that these are likely under reports and don't perfectly capture events. For instance HKCS gathers self report from middle and high school students

Sarah Brummett (she, her): BRFSS captures self report from adults ages 18+

Sarah Brummett (she, her): and ED/hospitalization would capture some events as well

Sarah Brummett (she, her): but there could be overlap

Sarah Brummett (she, her): and not all attempts would be captured in those data streams

Sarah Brummett (she, her): Andrea- HKCS has their own info and dashboard here <https://cdphe.colorado.gov/hkcs>

Sarah Brummett (she, her): if that's helpful

Andrea Nederveld: Great - thanks. I think I am thinking about a time I was hoping to get county specific data or something. It was for another grant looking at suicide prevention in youth.

Sarah Brummett (she, her): There's different data sharing rules for different data sets. So for HKCS we often can't share the data itself but can report at county or health statistics region

Andrea Nederveld: Gotcha

Mason Hohstadt: @Andrea - most often one has to work with the school district itself for them to release the HKCS data. Which can be a barrier. I've been trying to get it for my area.

- Andrea Nederveld: Yes - that's what I found. I could get data from Mesa County schools b/c I help with a wellness committee here, but not for any other school districts. I should say that I could have requested the data, but it needed approval at the level of the super, and we didn't have time to do that for the proposal.
- Sarah Brummett (she, her): If I missed someone's question let me know!
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): Is suicide attempt, depression, and crisis info available by county from the RMHP?
- Sarah Brummett (she, her): @Sallie- yes the disability community is included as a priority population especially within El Paso County
- Erica Kitzman: Thank you for saying this!
- Erica Kitzman: Mesa County has lost nearly 500 men in the past 10 years.
- Erica Kitzman: Is the hotline geolocated?
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): And info around continuity of care from crisis call to engagement in services
- Erica Kitzman: I heard from a group of Olathe ranchers who said they would never all a hotline because they know that police will show up. The talked about not being able to risk their livelihood by being taken away to treatment for several days.
- Elena Broaddus | she/her: Wow, thanks for sharing that, Erica
- Erin Ivie-SpeakUp ReachOut: Erica I here similar comments about not wanting to reach out because they fear that their firearms will be taken away and never returned
- Erin Ivie-SpeakUp ReachOut: hear* gosh it must be Friday
- Breeah Kinsella: The red flag legislation has folks down here in the SW a little worried, especially folks of color and indigenous folks.

- Janice: Again, education and support for the families and supporters of those with ideation, of all ages, will have a positive impact. This is such an overlooked population, yet the largest, by far!
- Janice: Trauma informed care can also be improved. More CAMS would be helpful. It's considered to time intensive. Those in crisis find it helpful.
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): I'm specifically referencing RMHP
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): There's only raw data for suicides not attempts or crisis
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): or suicidal ideation
- Mason Hohstadt: I think that's a difficult measure to pull as that is based on the hospital/provider and how they actually "code" the visit.
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): That would be tremendously helpful because it feels like we only have one side of the coin looking at actual deaths
- Erica Kitzman: Geolocation is a huge barrier to use.
- Michelle Muething: I don't think they can
- Mason Hohstadt: @Arlina working with the two hospitals in my county both code or track those individuals differently.
- Michelle Muething: This is a HUGE conversation at the national level
- Arlina Yazzie (She/Her/Hers): If there are orgs that report back to the RAE, it would be so helpful to have uniform coding. I realize it is subjective but it would be better than nothing to have an idea what demographics of people are experiencing these issues
- liz: There is evidence of increased suicide risk in a variety of physical health conditions-many chronic illnesses, concussion, sleep disturbance, etc. Does RMHP look at those in relation to PHQ screenings, etc to assess risk and considerations for treatment?
- Erin Ivie-SpeakUp ReachOut: CO Dept Ag has a new campaign
- Erica Kitzman: Yes, threat of carceral "care" is a problem with the rural ranchers.
- Michelle Muething: Just because the "ranchers" don't reach out, QPr and others t4each others to reach out on their behalf
